

ADVICE TO PASSENGERS USING EU AIRPORTS

We would ask passengers to keep their hand baggage to an absolute minimum and include only essential items – tickets, passports, medication, the usual small electrical items recommended for hand luggage and valuables. All other items should go into suitcases. We would also remind passengers of the need to keep all baggage locked and with them when travelling to the airport and not leave baggage or parcels unattended on the airport.

Passengers are also reminded that certain items are not allowed to be carried in hand luggage on to the aircraft. This includes:

- ☐ Toy or replica guns
- ☐ Knives – including penknives and household knives
- ☐ Catapults
- ☐ Household cutlery
- ☐ Razor blades
- ☐ Tradesmen's tools
- ☐ Darts
- ☐ Scissors and Tweezers
- ☐ Knitting needles
- ☐ Sporting bats
- ☐ Billiard, snooker or pool cues
- ☐ Hypodermic needles (unless required for medical reasons)


No liquids, cosmetics, aerosols are allowed on board unless in a container that holds 100ml or less

Security Notice

You should always check size limits with your airline and airport before you travel. Airlines may also have their own rules about the number of bags you are allowed to take on the aircraft. It's best to contact them if you have any questions.

Travelling with liquids

We strongly advise you to pack any liquids that you don't need whilst onboard the aircraft in your hold baggage. However, if you do need to travel with liquids, please be aware of the following restrictions which apply to all liquids you wish to carry through an airport security checkpoint:

- All liquids must be in individual containers not greater than 100ml capacity. They must be placed in one transparent re-sealable transparent bag, no larger than 20cm x 20cm (8" x 8") in size, and fit comfortably inside the bag so it can be fastened closed.

- Only one bag per passenger is allowed. The bag must be clear and re-sealable, such as 'ziplock' bags or bags with pressable seals. Larger bags or bags that are sealable, such as fold-over sandwich bags are not allowed

- Each passenger must remove their clear plastic bag from their hand baggage and place it in on the conveyor belt for X-ray screening

- Liquids in containers of more than 100ml capacity can be packed in your hold baggage. Exemptions to the liquids rule applies for liquid medicine or baby milk/food



Liquids include:


- all drinks, including water, soup and syrups
- cosmetics and toiletries, including creams, lotions, oils, perfumes, mascara and lipsticks
- sprays, including shaving foam, hairspray and spray deodorants
- pastes, including toothpaste
- gels, including hair and shower gel
- contact lens solution
- any other solutions and items of similar consistency

Essential medicines, including inhalers and liquid dietary foodstuffs

You are allowed to carry essential medicines of more than 100ml in your hand baggage, but you will need:

- prior approval from the airline and departure airport
- supporting documentation from a relevant qualified medical professional (eg a letter from your doctor or prescription)

Remember to take only what you need for your journey. Extra supplies and larger containers of medicine can go in your hold baggage.



Security Notice cont.....

Baby food and baby milk

You are allowed to take baby food, baby milk and sterilized water in your hand baggage. This includes:

- ☐ soya milk for babies
- ☐ sterilized water for the baby (must be in a baby bottle)
- ☐ formula, breast milk or cow milk specifically for babies
- ☐ baby food of various consistencies

You are allowed to take enough for the journey. In some cases this may be over 100ml. The adult carrying the baby food or milk may be asked to verify it by tasting.

Lighters

One lighter per person may be carried on a flight. Lighters are considered to be liquids and should be put inside the plastic bag or screened separately. You must keep the lighter on your person throughout the flight.

It is very important that you do not:

- ☐ place it in your hold baggage
- ☐ return it to your hand baggage after screening

Further passenger information

Laptops/electrical items

You're allowed to take electrical items (like laptops and hairdryers) in your hand baggage, but they have to be removed and screened separately.

Essential medical equipment

You are allowed to bring medical equipment if it is essential for your journey. The equipment will be screened separately and must be accompanied by supporting documentation from a qualified medical professional, such as a letter from your doctor.

Other items

Pushchairs, walking aids and wheelchairs are usually permitted in the cabin, but they will need to be security screened first.

Musical instruments

If you plan on travelling with a large musical instrument, you should contact your airline before booking. You may need to make special arrangements, like buying an extra seat. Any musical instrument you bring with you will need to be screened separately.

Airport Shopping

You can fly with everything you buy after security. All shops and catering outlets are open to all passengers before and after security. However the restrictions on liquids still apply for items purchased before security. After the security check, passengers are able to take all items purchased in the departures lounge onboard the aircraft.
